 - The perinatal mental health data and information collected by Local Health Boards and the Welsh Government:
 - The number of women who have been placed due to perinatal mental ill health on an adult psychiatric ward without their child;
 - The timescales within which all Local Health Boards will be expected to have signed up to the Royal College of Psychiatrists' quality standards; and
 - Further information on the directory of third sector services and how it is updated.

 - at the end of the 2018-19 financial year, a comprehensive outline of the settings in which women have been treated for perinatal mental ill health, including in the community, adult psychiatric wards, and mother and baby units; and
 - six monthly updates on progress in relation to the Committee's recommendations and other developments in perinatal mental health services in Wales.
